PRESCHOOL (AGES 3-5)

1ST HOUR:

Creative Arts & Crafts: Amanda

Class Description: Each week, we will create a wonderful arts and crafts take-home project using a wide variety of fine motor skills to create works of art!

Supplies: glue sticks, crayons, and safe scissors. Please let me know if your child has any allergies, as I will also be providing occasional snacks.

2ND HOUR:

Preschool Storytime: Ruth

Class Description: Each week, we will work on sitting as a group and listening to books read aloud. Kids will be encouraged to ask questions and be involved in the story. Each class will have a book-themed coloring page or craft. A small snack will be provided. Please advise if there are any dietary restrictions.

Supplies: crayons and a water bottle

GRADES K-2

1ST HOUR CLASS OPTIONS (2):

Physical Science & Electricity: Amanda

Class Description: This class will explore the very basics of physical science (chemistry, physics, and engineering) and electricity using STEM activities and experiments. We will build our own Bristle Bots, make parachutes and paper airplanes, elephant toothpaste, and more.

Supplies: \$5 fee, Scissors, crayons, and pencil

Fun With Food: Jessica

Class Description: In Fun with Food, we will do just that...have fun with food! We will learn what is in our food that will make us healthy and strong. We will talk about protein, leafy greens, and tasty fruits. We will make art with food and then eat it! We will discuss what to eat to make our teeth

strong, and we will try new foods. We will even be swept away to Italy to discuss their culture and food. The food we eat will not contain any artificial dyes.

Supplies: None

2ND HOUR CLASS OPTIONS (2):

Literature Pockets: Katie

Class Description: We will explore classic nursery rhymes and poems through reading, art, and crafts. Each week, a poem or rhyme will be read out loud. The children will build a binder with a pocket for each rhyme. Each pocket will hold our crafts and activities for the day. At the end of the nine weeks, your student will have a complete binder to take home.

Supplies: Scissors, crayons, glue stick, glue, pencil.

Fun with Spanish II: Ruth

Class Description: We will continue to have fun learning Latin American Spanish vocabulary and phrases through activities, games, songs, crafts, stories, and Bible verses. We will also be introduced to various Latin American cultures and activities. We will be continuing on from our class in the fall, but that class is not a prerequisite.

Supplies: Please bring pencils, crayons (colored pencils or markers will work too), scissors, and glue.

GRADES 2-4

1ST HOUR CLASS OPTIONS (1):

Money Matters: Christen (2nd-4th)

Class Description: Get ready to role-play our way through different financial transactions as we learn why money matters! We are going to see what happens to our money on payday, manage a savings account, write out weekly checks to pay our household expenses, go grocery shopping with a credit card, and go out to eat with a debit card. We will see what is happening behind the scenes at the bank to gain a better understanding of money and how our digital wallet works. We will also look at a bit of the history of trade and currency to get a foundational understanding. Finally, we will be “purchasing” our weekly snacks (provided). Mostly, we will be doing LOTS of role playing with props and costumes as well as some games, so bring your silly side and energy as we have fun learning all about money!

Supplies: Writing pencils, erasers, pencil sharpener, glue stick, scissors, colored pencils or markers. Possible weekly props/costumes to bring from home from stuff you already have!

2ND HOUR CLASS OPTIONS (1):

Skills & Drills: Kerri (2nd-4th)

Class Description: In Skills & Drills, students will be introduced to traditional sports games and a variety of PE games—games that will test strategy, aim, team building, agility, logic, and more. Students will also learn the basic rules and terminology of popular sports. The class period will be structured and action-packed, so make sure your student(s) are ready to participate!

Supplies: Water bottle, gym shoes, athletic clothes

GRADES 3-5

1ST HOUR CLASS OPTIONS (2):

Colorful Creations: Michelle

Class Description: In this class, your child will explore the color wheel—from basic concepts to more advanced applications—and discover how color plays a vital role in design. They will then apply their artistic skills and understanding of color to create a variety of vibrant, hands-on art projects.

Supplies: \$10 class fee & an old t-shirt

Exploring Nature with Children: Torie

Class Description: This class will loosely follow a curriculum by Raising Little Shoots called “Exploring Nature with Children.” As a class, we will focus on one topic a week, and each child will record their discoveries in their personal nature journal. Studies will range from nature notebooking, sketching, animal anatomy, art, and poetry relating to the topic, crafts, writing prompts, and scripture as we explore God’s beautiful creation!

Supplies: Blank sketchbook, colored pencils, ruler, glue stick.

2ND HOUR CLASS OPTIONS (2):

The Amateur Meteorologist: Sommer

Class Description: In this class, we will explore weather and weather forecasting. We will identify classifications of clouds, observe the water cycle through various hands-on activities, build an anemometer, create weather journals, and learn about various severe weather events.

Supplies: 3-ring binder, colored pencils or markers, scissors, pen or pencil.

Around the World: Sabrena (4th-7th)

Class Description: Join me in exploring the world! We will visit different continents and discover cultures that are unique in their own history, art, food, traditions, and so much more! This class will be a combination of history, arts/crafts, cooking (and eating), and geography.

Supplies: pencils, crayons, notebook paper. There will be other supplies needed throughout the semester. I will email with more details.

Strength & Conditioning: GRADES 6-8 (unless otherwise noted)

1ST HOUR CLASS OPTIONS (3): Carrie (5th-8th)

Class Description: Each week, we will complete various body weight workouts with a focus on different exercise schemes and proper form of movements. We will also play a variety of active group games and will complete the Presidential Fitness Test in the last week of the semester.

Supplies: tennis shoes, activewear, water

Recycled Art: Karen Class Limit: 10

Class Description: Join us as we turn junk mail, old blue jeans, used sheets, well-loved t-shirts, and more into usable creations. We will create items like handmade paper cards, fabric coil baskets, and crocheted place mats.

Supplies: While most of our materials are "free", a \$10 class fee will cover equipment needed to make our projects.

2ND HOUR CLASS OPTIONS (2):

Cake Decorating: Amy (7th-12th) Class Limit: 10

Class Description: Join us for a fun and creative nine-week journey into the art of cake decorating! In this hands-on class, students will learn essential techniques such as piping with various tips, working with fondant, and creating beautiful designs on cupcakes and cakes. We will also explore how to make and use different frostings, including buttercream and meringue, to bring our designs to life. Whether you're a beginner or looking to build on your skills, this class offers a sweet opportunity to practice, experiment, and develop your decorating talents in a supportive, creative environment.

Supplies: \$20 fee.

Comic Writers: Jennifer (5th-8th)

Class Description: Calling all comic enthusiasts! In Comic Writers, we will explore the writing process from beginning to end while creating our very own comics! Come prepared to plan, design, and create your own comics....including illustrations!

Supplies: Scissors, colored pencils, folder, glue stick.

GRADES 9-12
(unless otherwise noted)

1ST HOUR CLASS OPTIONS (3):

Local Ecology and Botany: Aaron (7th-12th)

Class Description: This course explores the plants, animals, and insects that define our regional ecosystems, with an emphasis on local botany and plant–animal relationships. Students will investigate how ecological processes such as pollination, predation, competition, and nutrient cycling shape biodiversity and community structure. Through field observation, plant identification, and data collection, students will gain a deeper understanding of how native flora and fauna interact within dynamic natural systems.

Supplies: Notebook and pencil.

Service Projects: Toni

Class Description: We will spend the semester serving others! We will make cookies, cards, and crafts for the senior citizens at Westview Healthy Living. We will also make things for the local police and fire departments. Most projects will be made in class, but some at-home baking might be requested a time or two. The goal for this class is to get the focus off of ourselves and serve others. If your child wants a volunteer opportunity or service project to put on their resume or college application, this would be a great way to do that!

Supplies: scissors, glue, colored pencils, watercolor palette/brush, sharpie marker, and Bible. \$20 per student is requested and will go toward purchasing containers for the baked goods and craft supplies for the projects.

Become an Author: Trudie (8th-12th)

Class Description: Learn to brainstorm, plan, write, edit, format, design, and self-publish your own children's picture book.

Supplies: Students will need: an Amazon.com account (or use a parent's account), have access to a laptop or iPad for typing and formatting the book, have permission to use Canva.com, and approximately \$10-15 to purchase a copy of their book.

2ND HOUR CLASS OPTIONS (2):

Lifestyle, Nutrition, & Fitness: Lydia

Class Description: “Your someday is made up of thousands of right nows, so begin today.” Ruth Chou Simmons

As it relates to your lifestyle, nutrition, and fitness, let’s learn what you can easily start today and take into your future. Let’s dig into what health is and how Scripture truly does give us everything we need for life and godliness. We will look at biblical principles, give practical applications, and have some hands-on fun along the way!

Supplies: Athletic clothing/shoes (will let students know in advance when they’ll need these), two lined notebooks, pen or pencil, Bible or Bible app.

Intro to Forensic Science: Annaliese

Class Description: This class integrates a biblical worldview of forensic science with hands-on investigation techniques and will cover crime scene analysis, evidence collection, and judicial proceedings. Topics include: DNA, fingerprints, shoe prints, blood splatter patterns, ballistics and more! Students will also get to hear from a law enforcement special guest speaker. Please note there may be photos and discussions of actual crime scenes.
